#### When a child starts the conversation

Determine true intent – "Why do you want to discuss this?" "How long have you been thinking about becoming a Christian?" "Why did you first start thinking about becoming a Christian?" This will help you know where the child is in his/her understanding.

#### The Point – we want the child (or adult) to understand what it means to be a Christ Follower

Instead of starting with Jesus' death on the cross, I like to start at the very beginning.

- God made the world and God made people to have a special relationship with Him.
- Because of sin, that caused a problem in our relationship with God.
- Jesus came to show us how to live and to take the punishment for our sin.
- Because of what Jesus did we can be forgiven and have a right relationship with God.
- This relationship is not just about going to heaven when we die, this is about living every day following Jesus.
- To accept God's give one must
  - Admit that he/she is a sinner
  - Believe that Jesus died on the cross for us and that his death paid the penalty for our sins
  - Commit his/her life to follow Jesus as Lord - to continue learning from Jesus and following Him as long as we live!

#### Model Discussion

##### **God's Plan**

- "God loves you and has a great plan for your life," Psalm 139:13-16
- "Tell me one thing that is special about the way God made you."
- "Why does a person need to become a Christian?"

### **The Problem of Sin**

- “Tell me about Adam and Eve.”
- “We have all sinned,” Rom 3:23 (a child must sense he is lost before he can be saved”)
- “What is sin?” Have child name a sin, but don’t invade his privacy by asking a sin he has done.
- “Sin is choosing to do things our way, not God’s way.”
- “Sin is doing something you know you are not supposed to do, or not doing something you know you are supposed to do.”
- “Have you ever sinned?” (note – it is critical for a person to understand that he/she is a sinner. If a person is not there yet he/she is probably not ready to make this decision.)
- “How does God feel when we sin?”
- “Sin makes us separate from God and hurts our relationship with other people.”
- “Even though we choose to sin, God still loves us and offers to forgive us,” Rom 5:8.

### **What Jesus did**

- “Jesus died for us”, John 3:16
- “Tell me what you know about Jesus.”
- “Why did Jesus have to die?”
- “What happened after Jesus’ death?”
- “Jesus had to be punished for our sins so we would not have to be away from God forever.

### **Becoming a Christian**

- “Do you know how to become a Christian?”
- A – Admit to God you are a sinner
- B – Believe that Jesus died for you
- C - Commit your life to Jesus, to let him be your Lord. This is the beginning of a new way of life, of following Jesus every day.

### **What is next?**

An older child who has heard the gospel presentation many times before and has a good understanding may be ready to make this decision now. A younger child who is just hearing the gospel for the first time may not be ready. In John 6:44 Jesus said, “For no one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them to me.” If a child is asking questions, I believe the Holy Spirit is at work. But that does not mean the child is ready to make this decision.
